Notice of Proposed change to Bylaw 12.10 presented to Membership at 2020 AGM

<u>Reasoning:</u> In review of the BCFOA Policy 4 – Complaint Process, due diligence was taken to ensure the changes were in aligned with the 2018 Bylaws. It was found there was an inconsistency in two of the bylaws, namely:

Bylaw: Part 8- Committees, sub section(s) 8.10 item (b) or (c) with consideration of appointments as in subsection 8.11.

Wording of this Bylaw:

8.10 The Board

- (a) must appoint an election committee in advance of each annual general meeting,
- (b) must appoint a conduct review committee as required,
- (c) must appoint a grievance committee as required, and
- (d) may appoint other committees as the Board considers necessary.

&

Bylaw Part 12 - Discipline of Members

Wording of this Bylaw:

Complaint

12.10 A member in good standing may make a complaint alleging improper conduct contrary to the Code of Ethics or a violation of the Constitution of the Association or other provisions of these Bylaws by delivering a written notice, providing details of the complaint, to the secretary. As

soon as practicable, the secretary must deliver the notice to the chair of the conduct review committee.

Inconsistency for consideration:

Change to Bylaw 12.10 to clarify the latter part as the secretary can not deliver notice without appointment of the Board as per Bylaw 8.10 (b).

Therefore, change to wording:

Complaint

12.10 A member in good standing may make a complaint alleging improper conduct contrary to the Code of Ethics or a violation of the Constitution of the Association or other provisions of these Bylaws by delivering a written notice, providing details of the complaint, to the secretary. As soon as practicable, the secretary must deliver the notice to the chair of the conduct review committee. Board to appoint a committee as defined in Bylaw 8.10(b).
